Housing

At 360°kids, we prioritize providing a safe and supportive home for youth aged 16-26 who are experiencing homelessness. We believe in the value and uniqueness of each individual and aim to prevent and assist them in finding stable housing.

Nightstop

In 2017, 360°kids became the first accredited Nightstop provider in Canada. Our program offers young people a safe and warm home for the night, thanks to our dedicated and vetted community volunteers. It is a temporary housing program that provides a safety net for youth who are forced to leave their homes. Nightstop places young people in a home for the night or up to 6 weeks, with a trained volunteer host family. For more information contact 647-225-9412.

Connections

Connections is the only emergency housing facility catering to homeless youth in the southern region of York Region. This program operates 7 days a week, providing 14 single-occupancy rooms, basic needs, wraparound services, and assistance in finding appropriate, affordable, and stable housing. SHINE Program

Our SHINE program is a voluntary program that offers a combination of housing and support for youth who are facing a housing crisis. We have two homes with 13 beds located in East Markham. Youth are accepted from anywhere in York Region.

S.T.A.Y. (Supportive Transitional Apartments for Youth)

This is a voluntary transition program for youth, where they pay rent and can stay for up to one year. We provide various opportunities for youth to engage in recreation, health and fitness, cooking, skills upgrading, and employment programs. A Youth Mentor is also available to provide support with goal setting, problem solving, and achieving

HOPE Program

The HOPE Program provides emergency and transitional housing and wrap-around services for female survivors of human trafficking aged 16-26. Our services support the survivors by providing a safe nurturing environment, counselling, medical attention, life skills and self-esteem building tools to promote a healthy transition to independent living. Transitions

Transitions is our extended transitional housing program for youth. The program works on a graduated market rent concept with case management support. Youth are able to live at Transitions for a period of up to 3 years or when their goals for independent living are accomplished and they have determined that they are ready to move on. Our Youth Hub is committed in creating a safe and inclusive space for all vulnerable youth aged 13-26. With a monthly reach of over 350 individuals, we offer a wide range of services under one roof. From life skills training to immediate needs like shelter and food, we strive to meet the diverse needs of our young people. We also provide referrals to other organizations for specialized support outside our scope. Our holistic approach aims to empower youth and connect them with the resources they need to thrive.

Provincial Youth Outreach Workers

Our Provincial Youth Outreach Workers connect with vulnerable youth aged 12-21 who are not yet connected to our programs or other community services. Their goal is to build relationships and refer them to the necessary services to meet their needs. For more information contact 647-299-4861.

Family & Natural Supports Program (FNS)

The FNS program aims to strengthen relationships between youth and their families/natural supports. Youth work with FNS workers to identify support systems and learn conflict management tools. The FNS team uses client-specific plans to achieve stability in the youth's life. The goal is to prevent youth homelessness and emergency housing in York Region by fostering positive connections.

Aftercare and Transitional Support (ATS)

The ATS Program assists youth transitioning out of the care of the Children's Aid Society. ATS addresses their various needs and provides support with housing, counselling, education, life skills, career planning, legal matters, substance abuse, and job search. Counselling

Through our counselling program, youth identify and address barriers that are preventing them from moving towards their goals. Our individual and family counsellors provide these young people with a safe setting, independent from other aspects of their life. Leadership Engagement Gang Intervention Team (L.E.G.I.T)

360°kids' L.E.G.I.T team works with all youth regardless of their background, from a community based and non-judgmental lens meeting youth wherever they feel safe in our community.
